REPORT

Theme of Workshop

The term Jainism which means faith of Jains is derived from the word Jina which means the conqueror or the sensual inclinations and tainted emotion. Thus Jina is one who conquers the inclinations of five senses, destroys all obscuring karmas and attains Omniscience through self-effort including observing vows, penance etc. Thus Jainism is has a mature tradition of metaphysics and spirituality. The name of c rya Kundakunda shines like a resplendent constellation in the sky of this rich tradition. He was an author of many treatises, one of which is Samayas ra, which is the most outstanding one in the field of spirituality. It is replete with many mystical ideas and many thoughts worth contemplation. Kundakunda needs no introduction. He was born in the 1st century B.C. His great book Samayas ra has 400 odd verses and covers the state of empirical soul (par samay) and it journey to become pure soul (sva-samay). Nothing surpasses the excellence of Samayas ra that is self-contained, self-determining and self-sufficient in its objective of identifying pure and empirical soul. The soul is the sole determinant of its own pure psychic status. The soul never loses its soul hood. The author simultaneously describes the state of embodied self-side by side to make us understand the difference between transcendental or pure soul and our own soul embodied with impurities from which it is to be liberated.

Samayas ra deals with the nature of the self, the term *samaya* being used synonymously with *tman* or *Brahman*. Samayas ra is the ultimate conscious reality. The enlightened soul has the infinite glory. It has its innate ability to demolish the power of Karmas- both auspicious as well as inauspicious- *pu ya* and *p pa* which are the cause of the cycle of births and deaths and are an obstacle in the path of the achieving liberation from this cycle. In a living organism the soul can be conceived as the nucleus circumscribed by the limits of the gross physical body. It is to be liberated and enlighten. Right faith (*Samyak Dar ana*), Right knowledge (*Samyak Jñ na*) and Right conduct (*Samyak C ritra*) constitute the Path to attain liberation of soul i.e. *mok a* and called *Mok am rga*. The trio is known as "The three Jewels - *Ratnatraya*". However these three are one and part of the inherent nature of the pure soul but described separately for us to understand and practice, one must take a transcendental view beyond all standpoints to realize the pure soul. Samayas ra is a reality, concept and text par excellence.

The term Samayas ra means the essential nature of the Self. This absolute Unity is transcendental in nature. Hence the various appellations based upon different points of view really have no relevancy in that state. The reality of the external world is admitted by the Jain metaphysics and c rya Kundakunda follows the tradition of Jain metaphysics.

In this seven-days workshop, Samayas ra was taught in a comprehensive manner by a distinguished team of scholars very well conversant with the text and its author.

Venue for the Workshop

Earlier the venue for this workshop was finalized at ISJS center-Mangalayatan University, Aligarh. However, due to ICPR recommendations, the venue for the workshop was shifted to Shri Atma Vallabh Jain Smarak Shikshan Nidhi, Delhi which incidentally is also ISJS Centre for its annual residential summer schools for overseas scholars.

Applications Process for the Workshop

After getting formal approval from ICPR, ISJS and ICPR jointly announced about this workshop on their websites along with application form. In a short time both ISJS and ICPR received more than 200 applications jointly. However, the seats were limited to 30. Therefore, ICPR and ISJS jointly shortlisted applications as per ICPR norms and 35 applications were shortlisted but due to some dropouts the final number of participants came to 33.

Preparation for the Workshop

After getting the formal approval from ICPR, ISJS immediately started contacting resources expert faculty members, participants to confirm their participation and making arrangements at the Smarak and other logistic facilities.

Simultaneously ISJS started planning the workshop schedule to include the concept of soul in all Indian religions with reference to Jain concept, detailed exposure of the author Kundkanda about his personal and philosophical and spiritual contributions, and atop down approach of introducing the overall concept of Samayas ra followed by detailed reading and teaching select verses from each chapter. Enough time was planned for discussions between the participants and the faculty members. Special session was also planned so that the aprticipants can select one of the ten topics for brief presentation to the group. To ensure 100% attendance by participants, attendance was recorded of each participant during the session itself.

Prof. G. C. Tripathi, Director, BL Institute of Indology was the Chairperson and he talked about Vedantic and Upanishadic view of pure soul and it's comparison to pure soul of Jainism.
