Subject: International Symposium on the Dating of Nirvan of Mahavirswami

Dear Scholars:

You are invited to participate in the subject historic symposium.

It is interesting to note that different Indian (Hindu, Jain, and Buddhist) and international scholars and historians have mentioned different years for the birth and nirvan of Tirthankar Mahavir Swami. It is essential that a detailed and comprehensive research project be conducted to resolve this issue.

It is generally accepted that Mahavir Swami was born in North Eastern region of India. However, there are different opinions in the history books and in the Jain scriptures with regard to the accurate location where he was born.

This study needs to be performed by different scholars in various fields. The following is a list of different fields relevant to this area of research:

- 1. Indian History (non-Jain) scholars: These scholars have a broad knowledge of the kings, kingdoms, and other historic personalities of the period between 1000 BC 400 BC.
- 2. Jain Swetambar Scholars: These scholars have knowledge of the ancient Swetambar scriptures and their writers. The goal is to see if the scripture writers left any clues with regard to the period the Tirthankars lived.
- 3. Jain Digambar Scholars: These scholars have knowledge of the Digambar sect ancient scriptures and their writers. The goal is to see if the scripture writers left any clues with regard to the time frame in which the Tirthankars lived.
- 4. Western Historians and Scholars: There are history scholars who have the knowledge of the ancient Jain scriptures and their writers. The goal is to investigate what dates they support and what reference materials they may have used.
- 5. Astronomy Scholars: These are the Jain scholars who will research all ancient Jain scriptures to look for some astronomical phenomenon such as several types of conjunctions of planets, Nakshatras, comets, the Sun, and the Moon. They will also research other astronomical phenomenon such as solar and lunar eclipses which might have occurred during the lives of the 23rd and 24th tirthankaras. These clues may help in dating the 24th and 23rd Tirthankars using modern astronomy tools.
