BRIEF REPORT OF THE PROGRAM

The initiative by International School for Jain Studies (ISJS) to train young budding scholars of Jainism to enhance their research and writing skills to bring them on par it international scholarship began on October 16, 2023 in association with Loyola Marymount University, California (USA). For this 8-week intensive and residential training program, ISJS selected six candidates after thorough scrutiny of their and future interests, sincerity and potential along with review of their research proposal sought for consideration and use during the program.

The main components of the program were writing skill, research methodology, Jain technical terms (with their English equivalent and conceptual description), chronology of Jain Acharyas who are known for their literary contribution, and Jain faith and practices.

The program was inaugurated on October 16, 2023 and had two phases: first phase prior to Diwali and second phase after Diwali till December 15, 2023. Based on their research proposals, participants were assigned to write a research paper by applying the techniques of research.

Dr. Shrinetra Pandey, Program Director was the key faculty for the entire program. Dr. Swasti Bhattacharya (USA) was a resource person for the first phase and Dr. Ashok Kumar Singh, Senior Research Fellow, ISJS was another resource person for the second phase of the program.

Dr. Shugan C Jain (President, ISJS) and Prof. Christopher Key Chapple (Director, MA in Yoga Studies, LMU, USA) delivered lectures on Jain faith and practices. For some special sessions, Prof. S. K. Tiwari (Deputy Director, Academic Staff College, BHU), Dr. Ana Bajzelj (UCLA, USA) and Dr. Anahita Hoose (BMPF Fellow at ISJS and Lecturer at UCLA, USA) were invited by ISJS.

- Academic review (review of seminar, conference, event, etc.)
- E-content development
- Sending intent to present a paper in a conference/ seminar as a student
- Designing an academic CV
