Concept: Studies in Jainism, especially pertaining to the art and archaeological perspectives have been taken up a little later compared to the study of archaeology of other religious traditions in India. Jainism has thrived in India since a long time and has left numerous traces of its existence, some being continued as sacred place of worship and some being reduced to unnoticed ruins. This course on Jain Art and Archaeology, is in keeping with the recent approaches of studying the past, focusing on the processes dealing with the emergence, dissemination, changes and transformations in Jainism through historical and archaeological investigations.

The important features of this course are its focus on the history and chronology of Jain monuments, monasticism, Jain architecture, iconography of the Tirthankaras and Yaksha-Yakshis and other deities, important Jain inscriptions, role and nature of patronage and various other factors which led to the dissemination of Jainism in varied parts of the country. A field trip to an important Jain heritage site may be held (subject to change).

The course will also examine the changes in different aspects of ancient society in the socioeconomic and religious backdrop, which played a significant role in shaping Jainism in India.

Course Objectives:

- To offer an opportunity to students to understand the rich Jain literary and philosophical heritage of India's past and also in the present society
- To introduce them to the history of Jainism in India and Jain pilgrimage centres of India.
- To acquaint the students with a basic outline of history and archaeology of Jainism and its relationship to various sources of study.
- To study the art, archaeology and history of Jainism through analytical and contextual insights.

- To get acquainted with the various processes involved in the emergence and spread of Jainism in ancient and Medieval India.
- To give an idea of the various processes that have went on to impact the ancient and later day nature of Jainism.

Course Outcome: After successful completion of the course, students would be able to interpret the Jain art, architecture, icons and archaeological material in a better context. They should be acquainted with knowledge tools sufficient to study the various processes of emergence, dissemination, degeneration and transformations in relation to Jainism in India. The students would also be imparted information on some important Jain heritage sites and their historical and archaeological analysis to a good extent.

Eligibility: Any Graduation from any UGC recognized University

Examination: The evaluation of this course will be done as per the University rules. 75% attendance is required to appear for the examination.

Pattern of Examination

A student will be assessed for his/her performance at a written test of 100 marks. At the end of the Course, there shall be an external examination of 50 marks and an internal examination of 50 marks.

The nature of the internal assessment would be varied, which will include minimum three components out of Written test, Essay writing, Group discussion, Seminar presentation, Tutorial writing, Field visit report, Article/book review and Oral examination.

The external examination shall be held at the end of course.

The internal assessment will be carried out throughout the year.

To pass the Certificate Course in Jain Art and Archaeology examination a candidate must obtain minimum 40% of the total marks in both-external and internal examinations.

Terms of Passing

After evaluation of the written examination the results will be declared in 'Grade' based on the marks obtained. The grades and the marks corresponding to them are as below:
