#### A REPORT ON

#### FOURTH BHAGWAN MAHAVIRA PRAKRIT FELLOWSHIP 2023-24

The International School for Jain Studies 'ISJS' proudly completed its fourth Bhagwan Mahavira Prakrit Fellowship Program. This annual program is being conducted by ISJS with the financial support of the Vardhman Charitable Foundation, USA (<a href="www.jvcf.org">www.jvcf.org</a>) to equip the scholars of Jain studies with proficiency in the ancient language of Jain canonical literature and enable them to read Jain scriptures.


#### > COURSE CURRICULUM AND FACULTY MEMBERS

In the nine-month-long program, which begins in September, the participants study the iconic Prakrit text *Siddha-hem-shabdanushasan* in which the 12th-century Jain monk Hemachandra compiled 1119 sutras that comprise vowels, simple consonants, conjunct consonants, indeclinables, declensions, conjugations, numerals, verb substitutions covering many tendencies like metathesis, anaptyxis, etc. of Maharashtri Prakrit. Besides, it also includes Shauraseni, Magadhi, Paishachi, Chulika Paishachi, and Apabhramsa dialects of Prakrit. The teachers also cover Ardhamagadhi for a comprehensive understanding of Prakrit.

The complete program has been taught at Pune itself. Dr. Ashok Kumar Singh along with two other faculty members Ms. Pragya Jain and Ms. Megha Kadhe teach and train our participants at the ISJS. In the current academic year, ISJS also introduced a short course on Brahmi script by ISJS faculty member Dr. Mukesh Mehta which helped the participants in reading the Prakrit inscriptions written in Brahmi script.

#### PRACTICE AND EVALUATION


Other than word games, class exercises, and constant revisiting of the sutras, excerpts from various Jain and other literary texts were employed by the faculty members for teaching translation from Prakrit to English, like Acharanga, Uttaradhyayana, Dravyasamgraha, Bhagavati Aradhana, Abhijnana Shakuntalam, Karpuramanjari, Gathasaptashati, and





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many more. To evaluate the progress of the participants, monthly tests were organized and at the end of the course, a final evaluation was done through three written exams and a viva voce.

#### > CERTIFICATION

After successful completion of the course, participants were awarded a PG Diploma by ISJS in association with Deccan College Postgraduate and Research Institute (a deemed to be university), Pune.
