A REPORT ON

FIFTH BHAGWAN MAHAVIRA PRAKRIT FELLOWSHIP 2024-25

The International School for Jain Studies (ISJS) has proudly completed its fifth Bhagwan Mahavira Prakrit Fellowship program from September 1, 2024 to May 31, 2025. This annual program is being conducted by ISJS with the financial support of Vardhman Charitable Foundation, USA (www.jvcf.org) to equip the scholars of Jain studies with proficiency in the ancient language of Jain canonical literature and enabling them to read Jain scriptures.

INAUGURAL CEREMONY

The program started on Monday, September 2, 2024, with a formal inaugural session. The participants were introduced to the faculty members. They also introduced themselves sharing their backgrounds and interests. Program Director Dr. Shrinetra Pandey presented the course structure to the participants, along with essential administrative instructions. Dr. Ashok Kumar Singh explained the methodology of the program and motivated the students to study well.

In an engaging encounter, the participants had the opportunity to interact with Dr. Manish Mehta, Chair – JAINA Diaspora Committee, Vice-chair – JAINA Academic Liaison Committee, Member – JAINA Long Range Planning Committee on October 19, 2024.

COURSE CURRICULUM AND FACULTY MEMBERS

In the nine-month-long program, which began in September, participants studied the renowned Prakrit text *Siddha-hem-shabdanushasan*. Compiled by the 12th-century Jain monk Hemachandra, this work consists of 1,119 sutras covering vowels, simple consonants, conjunct consonants, indeclinables, declensions, conjugations, numerals, and verb substitutions. It also addresses linguistic tendencies such as metathesis and anaptyxis within Maharashtri Prakrit. Additionally, the text encompasses Shauraseni,

Magadhi, Paishachi, Chulika Paishachi, and Apabhramsa dialects of Prakrit. To ensure a comprehensive understanding, teachers also include Ardhamagadhi in their lessons.

The entire program was conducted in Pune. Dr. Ashok Kumar Singh, along with faculty members Ms. Pragya Jain and Mr. Harshit Mishra, taught the course to the participants. ISJS also conducted a short course on the Brahmi script, which helped participants read Prakrit inscriptions written in Brahmi.

PRACTICE AND EVALUATION

In addition to word games, class exercises, and frequent revisiting of the sutras, faculty members utilized excerpts from various Jain and other literary texts to teach translation from Prakrit to English. These texts include *Acharanga, Sutrakritanga, Uttaradhyayana, Dashvaikalik, Paumachariyam, Saman Suttam, Bhagavati Aradhana, Mulachar, Dravyasamgraha, Abhijnan Shakuntalam, Gathasaptashati, Mricchakatikam,* as well as inscriptions from Ashoka and Kharvel.

To assess participants' progress, monthly tests were conducted, culminating in a final evaluation consisting of three written exams and a viva voce. The final examination was conducted from May 17 to May 25, 2025. Dr. Rajashree Mohadikar was the external subject expert who came to assess the participants this year.




